SEG Canada Foundation - Undergraduate Scholarship Application

The Society of Economic Geologists Canada Foundation (SEGCF) awards \$1,000 scholarships to support field or laboratory work related to an undergraduate thesis in economic geology. Decisions will be made by the SEGCF Awards Committee, based upon the quality of the research proposal, supervisor's endorsement and the student's academic standing.

Eligibility

To be eligible, a student must be either entering or in their fourth year of study at a Canadian University. Preference will be given to those applicants who are SEG Student Members.

Use of Proceeds

Funds must be used for field or laboratory work related to an undergraduate thesis in economic geology.

Reporting Requirements

Students are required to submit to SEGCF (kirstiesimpson@segweb.org) a copy of the abstract from their completed thesis along with a brief statement of how the award money was utilized. Students who fail to comply with the reporting requirements may not be eligible for future awards or other forms of financial assistance from SEG or SEGCF.

Application Process

1. Fill in the PDF fillable form below including a maximum 250 word thesis proposal.
2. Email the completed application form and a copy of your undergraduate academic record to kirstiesimpson@segweb.org
3. Your supervisor must complete the Supervisor Endorsement Form and email it to kirstiesimpson@segweb.org

Deadline

Applications must be received by **September 30th**, awards announced October 31.
